# How Do The Grants Align to Yield the Maximum Benefits for Supporting Children with Disabilities and Their Families

## *How Does it Help:*

- The assurance of evidence-based practices throughout the system and equal supports to families and children enrolled in the Early Intervention system.
- Recruiting and sustaining staff leads to increased staff in the system to support incoming families.
- Positive relationships between Part C and Part B leaders lead to better transitions for those eligible for Part B.
- New data system to better track family and child outcomes.
