

 - ✓ NTACT (OSEP & RSA)





Life Stage Transitions

- Transitions occur from one life cycle stage to the next
- Transition times often are the most challenging periods for families
- In families with a child with a disability, life cycle changes may be more stressful
- Key points that indicate transitions for youth without disabilities may be blurred or non-existent for youth with disabilities



Transition Covers All Of Life's Stages:

A "Transition" is any time an individual moves from one placement into another and are an ongoing process throughout an individual's life.

- → From Birth to 3 into Pre-School
- → From Pre-School into Kindergarten
- → From Kindergarten into Elementary School
- → From Elementary School into Middle School
- → From Middle School into High School
- → From High School into College or Post Secondary Education
- → From College/Post Secondary Education into Adult Living



Key Commonalities in Life Transitions

- > Embrace change and recognize the stress
- > Prepare and understand the next environment
- Build support networks and understand community and agency supports
- → Explore, understand, and access tools and resources
- → Practice self-care
- → Be patient and allow time for success celebrate the small gains



How Can We Make This Transition Easier on All Concerned?

- Presume competence
- Begin planning early and maintain consistency
- Involve ALL of the necessary players
- Provide professional development at all levels regarding the transition process and involve inter-educational and interagency partners in this training
- Each year have a "move up" day where the students and the families can meet the new teachers and staff



How Can We Make This Transition Easier on All Concerned? (continued)

- → Develop a plan where everyone knows their responsibilities
- → Observe stressors/ pressures/ situations beyond academic and connect with support
- → Coordinate the transfer of relevant information to the next placement
- → Link families and youth with other families and youth
- → Remember the three Cs Communication, Coordination, Collaboration



Collaboration is Essential

Thoughtful and engaging collaboration is key to ensuring "seamless" transitions

Each team member:

- Brings unique insights and expertise to the table
- Considers needs, interests and preferences of the student
- Determines how to support students as they transition
- Works together to plan services that lead to a successful transition



Student Participation and Engagement is Key

- → Hold high expectations
- Provide choices and ways to communicate
- → Encourage decision-making, expression of preferences, and participation in planning
- Provide opportunities to practice self-advocacy and independent living skills in a variety of settings
- Arrange learning and skill building tasks to be challenging, but not impossible not boring or irrelevant!
- → Assist the student with identifying and arranging for appropriate:
 - Natural supports
 - Accommodations
 - Assistive technology (AT)
