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#### The Podcast

- Released monthly, 2<sup>nd</sup> Tuesday of the Month at 8am ET
- About 30 minutes in length
- Highlights partnerships, promising practices, new resources

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
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#### General Structure

- Start with upbeat music (CC licensed)
- Our tagline: "Welcome to the accessible learning experience, where we help you turn learning barriers into learning opportunities."
- Introduce guests and summarize content of episode
- Interview (4-5 questions)
- Music and closing: "Remember, accessibility is everyone's responsibility."
- Music
- Disclaimer

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#### **Accessibility Features**

- Multiple options for listening: website (most accessible), Anchor, your preferred podcast player/app
- Closed captions synchronized to audio
- Keyboard and screen reader accessible player provided by CAST Figuration
- Downloadable transcript

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# Plan, Record, Edit, Share

Our workflow



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#### **Pre-Planning**

We have a 30-minute call with each guest where we go over:

- Making sure there is enough space on computer for recording file
- Tips for ensuring good audio: external mic or headset, quiet environment, etc.
- Key information to include in show notes: title, social media information this information is collected in a planning document (QR Code)
- Topics and questions to be addressed during interview
- Consent form (to be emailed from DocuSign)





### Recording

Recording is done through Riverside (about \$20 a month)

- Web-based tool (no software to install)
- Record locally to each person's computer and uploads to server in background (avoids latency issues)
- Records individual tracks as well as a combined track
- Provides basic editing features

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#### Edit

We use Garageband to record because it is already built into the Mac (free)

- Windows users can use Audacity (free)
- We use a template file to start each episode with the same intro (including music), closing, etc.
- Usually start with combined file from Riverside (has some mixing for audio levels and noise reduction applied to it already)



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## Captioning

We submit our files to a commercial service called Rev for captioning and transcripts:

- Cost is about \$1.50/minute
- About 1 day turnaround
- Upload file and get captions and transcripts in a variety of formats
- Has online editor to fix mistakes we recommend reviewing provide file as quality depends on captioner/transcriber
- Tip: Provide glossary to improve accuracy with technical terms/proper names



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## Sharing

We use Anchor to distribute a feed for our podcast:

- Free service
- Creates feed for other platforms: Apple Podcasts, Google Podcasts, Spotify and others
- Basic analytics: Plays, Spotify followers, Episode Rankings, Platforms



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#### Ideas for Podcast Episodes

- Highlight a partnership
- Share a new resource (drive traffic to website)
- Build buzz for an event (conference or convening)
- Provide testimonials and success stories
- What else?
