We will build the session on the previous family leadership refrain of "Nothing about us without us" to integrate "Nothing about YOU without YOU" that is reflected in the continued commitment and unwavering efforts of early intervention and early childhood special education (EI/ECSE) leaders to ensure family perspective is heard, valued, and influential in decision making. This interactive session will provide a bi-directional learning opportunity between the audience and presenters to explore ideas, tools, and strategies to achieve the crucial combination of supporting families in their roles as parents, leaders and vital partners to systems building for a better and brighter future of our nation's youngest citizens.
