school districts

 Due process hearings are among the most contentious options

Special education teachers are often required to testify



What is the professional and personal impact of that experience?



Survey results for special education teachers who have testified in a due process hearing

- 31 respondents
- 12 states represented
- Average of 19 years teaching experience (mostly in special education)







Impact of Testifying

Personal

- Significant event
- High stress level that affected mental health and overall wellbeing
- Detrimental physical health impacts (e.g., migraines, anxiety, insomnia)

Professional

- Increased workload
- Missed instructional time, often without coverage
- 43% stated they were less likely to remain a special education teacher



Instructional Impacts

Positive Impacts to:

- Record keeping and documentation
- IEP writing
- Progress monitoring
- Parent communication

Negative impacts to:

- Lesson planning
- Service delivery to other students
- Communication with families
- Collaboration with other practitioners



Importance of Adequate Preparation

- 74% felt that they received a sufficient amount of preparation
- Reviewing case with administration and/or attorney
 - File review
 - Summarize data
- Reviewing IDEA
- Mock practice
 - Which questions would be asked and how to answer
- "Demystify the process"
