Parent Center Network

- CPIR focuses on universal TA
- RPTACs focus on targeted and intensive TA to assist PTIs and CPRCs to enhance their capacity to serve parents, youth/young adults, and professionals effectively
- Parent Centers (PTIs and CPRCs) focus on supporting families, youth/young adults, and professionals



Center for Parent Information & Resources (CPIR)

OSEP's priority: "The CPIR, must, at a minimum:

- address parent centers' needs for universal TA on the following evidence-based education practices that improve [OSEP's 17 Priority Topics]; and,
- increase the coordination of parent training efforts".

In addition, CPIR:

- provides PTIs and CPRCs with products and materials to support their work with families
- Increases Parent Centers' knowledge and capacity in specific domains
- Increases the coordination of parent training efforts throughout the network



Region A CT, DC, DE, MD, ME, MA, NH, NJ, NY, PA, Puerto Rico, RI, VT, and US Virgin Islands: housed at the SPAN Parent Advocacy Network (NJ)

Region B AL, AR, FL, GA, LA, MS, NC, OK, SC, TN, TX, VA: housed at Parent to Parent of Georgia in collaboration with the Exceptional Children's Assistance Center of North Carolina

Region C IL, IN, IA, KS, KY, MI, MN, MO, MT, NE, ND, OH, SD, WI, WV, WY: housed at Wisconsin FACETS

Regional Parent TA Centers

OSEP's Priority:

- Meet the unique needs of Parent Centers in their Region to help them:
 - Train and inform parents about EI and educational evidence-based practices; their rights and responsibilities under federal, state and local laws; and the range of available educational options
 - Reach and effectively provide services to help more parents improve outcomes for their children, and youth to build their self-advocacy skills, including especially underserved families (LEP, low literacy, parents with disabilities, parents of youth in the juvenile justice or foster care system, militaryconnected families, and Native American families)
 - Effectively manage their projects and provide highquality training to staff to reach and serve all parents and youth in their catchment area



Technical Assistance "Buckets"

- Increase the capacity of Parent Centers to efficiently manage their work and maintain a stable, effective organization, capable of carrying out the requirements of a Federal grant
- Increase the capacity of Parent Centers to train staff, including multilingual staff, to provide effective outreach and services to underserved families of children with disabilities and youth with disabilities
- Increase Parent Center capacity to effectively reach and serve the families (parents and youth) in their catchment or target population

Parent Training & Information Centers (PTIs) and Community Parent Resource Centers (CPRCs)

- 26 CPRCs
- Serve targeted, underserved communities (geographic and/or language/ ethnicitybased)

- Will re-compete in 2026



Required Activities of PTIs and CPRCs

- Provide training and information to parents in how to help their children meet developmental and educational goals and lead productive lives
- Serve all disabilities, birth to 26, and children at risk of inappropriate identification
- Serve underserved parents
- Help parents
 - Understand their children's needs
 - Communicate and collaborate with schools and providers
 - Participate in decision-making
 - Get information about resources
 - Understand IDEA and other relevant federal and state laws
 - Participate in school activities
 - Participate in school reform



Required Activities of PTIs and CPRCs

- Help parents to resolve disputes
- Help parents and students understand their rights
- Help parents understand and use dispute resolution options
- Contract with State, at State option, to provide staff to explain mediation to parents
- Establish cooperative relationships with CPRCs/PTIs
- Network with appropriate partners





How these levels all work together

- CPIR provides resources to RPTACs, PTIs and CPRCs, and the public
- CPIR facilitates regular ongoing opportunities for Centers to connect across regions for information, expertise, and problem solving
- CPIR and RPTACs highlight PTI and CPRC innovations, promising practices, and emerging trends
- RPTACs regularly gather PTI and CPRC feedback that guide CPIR services



How these levels all work together

- RPTACs work with the CPIR to direct the development of new products
- PTIs and CPRCs develop and/or review CPIR products before they move into production
- PTIs and CPRCs are pivotal in providing the peer-to-peer mentoring offered by the RPTACs
- CPIR and RPTACs serve as content experts and trainers at local, state, regional and national events



How do you work with us?

- You can develop or share a product for Parent Centers for the parentcenterhub.org
- You can offer training through the CPIR or RPTACs to reach Parent Centers (virtually or face-to-face)
- You can involve us in your activities (new tools, resources, advisory boards, reviewers, etc.)
