► The purpose of this priority is to fund institutions of higher education with related services degree programs to expand or enhance curriculums, courses of study, and clinical experiences to increase the competencies of related services personnel to serve children with disabilities and their families in early intervention, early childhood and educational settings



Eligible Applicants



- Institutions of Higher Education
- private nonprofit organizations that have legal authority to enter into grants and cooperative agreements with the federal government on behalf of an institution of higher education
- ► Applicants with an active 84.325K, 84.325M or 84.325R grant in the discipline degree program being proposed for enhancement are **not** eligible to apply. Refer to the eligibility note in the application for additional information.



Award Information

- Awards are for a maximum of \$450,000 for 36 months.
- This program uses an unrestricted indirect cost rate.
- This program does not include any program-specific limitation on administrative expenses.

- In determining the significance of the proposed project, the Secretary considers the following factors:
 - the extent to which the proposed project will prepare personnel
 - The importance or magnitude of the results or outcomes likely to be attained by the proposed project.

► Enhance or redesign a current related services personnel preparation degree program to achieve the intended outcomes of the proposed project.



Quality of Project Services: Selection Criteria (45 points)

- In determining the quality of the proposed project evaluation, the Secretary considers the following factors:
 - The goals, objectives, and outcomes to be achieved by the proposed project are clearly specified and measurable;
 - The services to be provided by the proposed project reflect up-to-date knowledge, research and effective practice; and

Quality of Project Services: Selection Criteria, CONT. (45 points)

- In determining the quality of the proposed project evaluation, the Secretary considers the following factors:
 - The training or professional development services to be provided by the proposed project are of sufficient quality, intensity, and duration to lead to improvements in practice among the recipients of those services.



Management Plan: NIA Narrative

Demonstrate how the proposed project will.....

- Ensure the Project Director and key personnel have the qualifications and experience to carry out the project and can manage the project in a way to achieve objectives
- Ensure the time commitments of the Project Director and other key personnel are adequate to meet objectives
- ► The proposed project will meet its objectives



Management Plan (20 points)

In determining the quality of the management plan for the proposed project, the Secretary considers the following factors:

- The qualifications of key project personnel
- The adequacy of the management plan to achieve the objectives of the proposed project on time and within budget
- Appropriate time commitments of the Project Director and Co-PI to meet project objectives



Adequacy of Resources: NIA Narrative

Demonstrate how ...

- ► The applicant and any key partners have adequate resources to carry out the proposed activities; and
- ▶ The budget is adequate for meeting the project objectives.



Adequacy of Resources: 10 points

The Secretary considers the following factors...

- ► The adequacy of support, including facilities, equipment, supplies, and other resources, from the applicant organization or the lead applicant organization; and
- ▶ The extent to which the costs are reasonable in relation to the objectives, design, and potential significance of the proposed project

Quality of the Project Evaluation: NIA Narrative

The evaluation plan must describe how the proposed project will evaluate how ...

the goals or objectives of the proposed project will be met based on measurable project outcomes



Quality of the Project Evaluation: Selection Criteria (15 points)

In determining the quality of the proposed project evaluation, the Secretary considers the following factors:

- The extent to which the methods of evaluation are thorough, feasible, and appropriate to the goals, objectives, and outcomes of the proposed project; and
- The extent to which the methods of evaluation will provide performance feedback

Appendix A:

- Charts, tables, figures, graphs, screen shots and visuals that provide information directly relating to the application requirements for the narrative.
- Supplementary information should not be included

Competitive Preference Priority

- ► Applications from HBCUs, TCCUs, and other MSIs, and private nonprofit organizations that have legal authority to enter into grants and cooperative agreements with the Federal government on behalf of an HBUC, TCCU, and other MSI
- ▶ 0 or 3 points
- Refer to the FY2023 Eligibility Matrix to determine eligibility Request for Designation as an Eligible Institution and Waiver of the Non-Federal Cost Share Requirement

General Requirements & Assurances

- Make positive efforts to employ and advance in employment qualified individuals with disabilities
- Involve individuals with disabilities, or parents of individuals with disabilities ages birth through 26, in planning, implementing, and evaluating the project
- Maintain high-quality website
- ▶ Budget for attendance at a 3-day Project Director's conference in Washington, DC each year

General Requirements & Assurances, cont'd

Provide an assurance that the project will submit the enhanced curriculum and syllabi for courses that are included in the related services personnel preparation program.

Subgrants and contracts

- ► Under 34 CFR 75.708(b) and (c), a grantee under this competition may award subgrants--to directly carry out project activities described in its application--to the following types of entities:
 - IHEs,
 - nonprofit organizations suitable to carry out the activities proposed in the application, and
 - public agencies.

The grantee may award subgrants to entities it has identified in an approved application or that it selects through a competition under procedures established by the grantee, consistent with 34 CFR 75.708(b)(2).

Application Submission

- ► Applications must be submitted electronically using Grants.gov.
- Applications may not be submitted via email.
- Applications must be submitted no later than 11:59:59 p.m., Eastern Time, on May 1, 2024
- ► Application narrative sections and all other attachments to the application must be uploaded as a PDF (preferred) or Microsoft Word file.
- Format narratives and attachments with accessibility in mind.



Submission Tips

- Register early. Grants.gov may take five or more business days to complete. Be sure that your registration with the System for Award Management (SAM) is current.
- Submit early. Don't wait until the last day to submit your application. Grants.gov will put a date/time stamp on your application and then process it after it is fully uploaded.
- Verify submission is ok. Verify that Grants.gov received your submission on time and that it was validated successfully.



Application Tips

- Maximum funding levels for each grant are noted in the notice.
- Recommended organization, page limits, spacing, and font sizes facilitate the application review process.
- ▶ PDF files facilitate the consolidating of application elements and review process.
- ► Read carefully "Grants.gov Submission Procedures and Tips for Applicants" found in section B of the application package.
