# Social Media Campaign

# Informational Calls Conducted with States

- Purpose: Gather insights directly from states with high numbers of military-connected special education children.
- Method: Strategic discussions with educational leaders across the top ten states. CA, CO, FL, GA, HI, MD, NC, TX, VA, and WA were all invited to join the various calls set-up by OSEP.
- Findings: Identified prevalent issues and potential areas for policy enhancement. States also shared policies and procedures they already have in place to support Military Families.





# Interagency Collaboration

- Agencies Involved: Collaboration between OSEP and the Department of Defense (DoD), DoD Office of Special Needs, Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA), Office of Elementary and Secondary Education, Office of Under Secretary, First Lady's Office of The White House, and Administration of Community Living.
- Goals: Streamline resource sharing and program coordination.
- Strategies: Implement joint initiatives that directly benefit special education.
- Impact: Enhanced service delivery for military families.





# Role of DOD Liaisons

- Today's Call Objective: Introduce the role and activities of DoD liaisons in each region.
- Role of DoD Offices: Facilitate connections and streamline support from OSEP.
- Activities: Coordinate educational services and resources at the state level.





# Future Initiatives

Upcoming Developments: Commitment to producing a selfassessment and sharing and promoting the technical assistance materials produced by OSEP's TAD network as well as our Federal partners. Timeline: Scheduled release over the next six months.

- Goals: Address emerging needs and enhance support frameworks for military families.
- OSEP is also exploring future data collection to identify issues and trends relating to military connected families.







# Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP)



- DoD program, mandatory for activeduty service members with eligible family members.
- G/r members are mandatory per Service policy (typically 6-month orders).
  - G/r can use installation and Military OneSource support services regardless of activation or enrollment status.
- DoDI 1315.19

# \*IDEA Support\*

- OSN provides DoD policy and oversight for the provision of IDEA services on DoD installations.
- Early intervention services provided by Educational and Developmental Intervention Services (EDIS).
  - Overseas locations (OCONUS), some stateside (CONUS) installations.
- OCONUS EDIS also provides related services for DoDEA students
- DoDEA provides special education per IDEA and DoDI 1342.12 to eligible DoD dependents 3-21.
  - Preschool programs OCONUS





- OCONUS EDIS programs serve two distinct purposes
  - Early Intervention Services
  - Special Education Related Services
- CONUS EDIS programs at installations with a DoDEA school AND the family lives on the DoD Installation
- How can you help?



# Defense-State Liaison Office (DSLO)



- DSLO has assisted state policymakers in enacting more than 1,150 bills since 2008 covering occupational licensure, employment protection, consumer protection, family law, childcare, child protection, voting, education, health care and state judicial systems.
- DSLO regional liaisons assist state policymakers by providing educational information, identifying "best practice" legislation, and presenting testimony when requested.

#### **Key Message**

 Highly mobile children, including military children, are more likely to experience recurring educational disruptions and challenges, particularly those who need access to special education and related services. proceedings.

## Request

 Streamline processes to ensure timely establishment of comparable special education services upon relocation and reducing burdens associated with due process

# Status

- Identify other engaged community advocates for students with disabilities and highly-mobile students
- Engage with states as a coalition in targeted regions





Requirements for Fully Meeting Objective: Enact <u>at least one</u> of the following actions for <u>each</u> category:

- 1. Minimizing Delays
- Require any required evaluations be conducted no more than 30 days after transferring into the school system <u>OR</u>
- Clarify that existing advance enrollment policies apply to students with IEPs or 504 plans.
  <u>OR</u>
- Focus state disability programs on assisting military and other highly mobile families
- 2. Reducing Burdens
- Enact enhanced parental consent requirements related to eligibility, placement criteria and changes to services related to the transferring of IEPs or 504 plans between school districts <u>OR</u>
- Shift the burden of proof in due process cases to the school districts <u>OR</u>
- Require reimbursement of expert witness fees in due process cases in which a hearing officer finds in favor of the parents.

**Requirements for Partially Meeting Objective:** Enact <u>at least one</u> of the above actions to <u>either</u> 1) minimize delays or 2) reduce burdens

## What is it?

- Preliminary enrollment, registration, application
- At the same time as the general student population
- Temporary waiver of proof of residence
- 41 States

## **Benefits**

- Increased certainty through cross-state transitions
- Ability to apply to/participate in lotteries for special programs
- Ensure availability of school, courses or programs

## Requirements

- Documentation of a pending military relocation to the state
- Proof of residency provided to the school district within the required number of days after arrival at the new location


